#### **NHS Secret Santa**



Every year, on wards across NHS Lothian, many patients can't go home to their families during the festive period because they are too unwell. Being away from those you love at such a special time of year can affect your mood and be upsetting for family members.

To create a fun and engaging atmosphere for those in hospital during the festive period, NHS Lothian Charity supports over £70,000 of patient Christmas activities each year, thanks to the generosity of our NHS Secret Santas. This helps families celebrate together in the hospital, brighten our wards and improve mental and emotional wellbeing of patients. It also creates great job satisfaction for our NHS Heroes.

NHS Lothian staff go over and above their day-to-day role to bring festivities to our hospitals and communities. They spend time decorating wards and entrances shopping for items that will help lift the spirits of someone staying in the hospital.

Could your company be our NHS Secret Santa and help staff spread festive cheer for those too unwell to go home?

When Christmas Eve arrives, patients expect it to be like any other day on the ward - but NHS Lothian staff make it memorable, dressing up, playing music (with some bringing their musical talents to perform to patients) and organising games or activities. A small gift, Christmas crackers, or festive party food doesn't seem like much, but they make a big difference when you are unwell in the hospital and away from loved ones.

Julie Ferrier and Debbie James work as Charge Nurses in the rehabilitation wards at the Astley Ainslie Hospital, Edinburgh, caring for people with brain injuries. They have both worked every other Christmas caring for their patients throughout their long careers with NHS Lothian.

"We decorate the wards with multiple Christmas trees, and some patients get crafty and make their own decorations. A local choir visits and we all sing Christmas Carols. An NHS Lothian consultant with musical talents also comes to the wards and plays the guitar, and we all sing along.

The singing makes everyone feel included, even those patients whose brain injury means they currently can't speak. Even they can still sing along, as singing is controlled by a different side of the brain than speaking.

One of our patients had both legs amputated, then suffered a stroke, and as a result could not speak but he loved to sing. Joining in the Carol singing made him light up with joy, as the music triggered happy memories for him."

For the Research Department at RHCYP, the festivities begin as soon as a child steps through the door, thanks to staff like Clinical Support Worker Rachael.



"As soon as a family walks into our reception area, they see a giant Christmas tree covered in glitter and handmade baubles, and paper chains line the corridors, I could see that parents felt instantly more relaxed as soon as they walked through the door.

It's nice to be able to give the patients something back. One of the best things about NHS Lothian Charity is that they allow us the freedom to select the presents for the children on an individual basis. That means I can pick something specifically for each child and for their individual needs."
